2.	Management and Cleansing	2.1	To enhance environmental hygiene to combat human swine influenza, "Market Cleansing Day" has been introduced and will remain in force. The "Market Cleansing Day" for markets in the District is on the 5 <sup>th</sup> and the 20 <sup>th</sup> of each month. He appealed to stall operators to enhance cleansing by cleaning up their own stalls on the cleansing days. They should move the shelves to facilitate cleansing and wash the walls to maintain environmental hygiene.	All markets

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<b>B</b> 44.0	2.2	Stall operators raised the issue relating to cleansing of air ducts above stalls and other high places. In addition to the existing scheduled cleansing, the management company would arrange special cleansing operation at height when required. As replacement of water mains and painting works by the Architectural Services Department (ASD) were in progress, the special cleansing operation would be postponed until late March 2016. Upon completion of the replacement works, the management company would arrange cleansing at height to further improve the cleanliness of the high places.	Sheung Wan Market
	2.3	Some stall operators reported that the management company failed to cleanse the passageways every day and remove the gratings to thoroughly cleanse the drains on a regular basis. The management company had already urged the cleansing workers to cleanse the passageways and drains thoroughly every day and the situation had improved. Comprehensive cleansing works was conducted in the cooked food centre during Chinese New Year to cleanse the drains and remove oil and grease. The result was satisfactory.	Sheung Wan Market
	2.4	District Council Member Mr HUI Chi-fung aired the views of the elderly that the lift floor and the area outside the lift in Bonham Strand were quite wet. The situation had improved after the management company increased the	Sheung Wan Market

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	frequency of cleansing and mopping. Some stall operators suggested covering the lift floor with non-slippery material. After discussion with the Electrical and Mechanical Services Department (EMSD), it was found that the existing stainless steel lift floor was already anti-slip. It was believed that slippery floor was caused by lift users who wetted the floor. The management company would enhance cleansing and mopping and the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) would closely monitor the situation. If the anti-slip stainless steel flooring was damaged as a result of abrasion, replacement would be arranged immediately.	
	2.5 The representative of stall operators pointed out that cleansing of the public area in the Market at noon and at night was not satisfactory. FEHD had instructed the management company to step up supervision of cleansing workers to ensure that cleansing work was thoroughly carried out every night and that the Market was clean and hygienic at all times. 	2.6 Some stall operators reported that the lighting system of the market should be activated earlier in the morning. After adjusting the pre-set on/off time by EMSD, the lighting system activated fully at 5:45 in the morning. Stall operators were satisfied with the arrangement.	Sai Ying Pun Market

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	2.7 Some stall operators reported that the Market was filled with the strong odour of bleach after cleansing. FEHD had instructed the management company to follow up the issue by telling cleansing workers to dilute the cleaning detergent in an appropriate ratio to avoid the adverse effects on tenants and the public. 	2.8 Some stall operators pointed out that water would flow from the footbridge on the 2 <sup>nd</sup> floor to the pavement during rainy days or cleansing of the Market. The management company had checked the drainage of the footbridge and urged the cleansing workers to avoid splashing water on the pavements when cleansing the Market. The situation had improved. 	2.9 Some stall operators pointed out that the passageways and lifts of the Market had recently been used for transporting refuse. FEHD had instructed the management company to follow up the issue by conducting inspections to stop such activities.	Shek Tong Tsui Market

	4.3 Refurbishment of the male and fentoilets on the second floor comment on 20 February by ASD and expected to complete in early M. 	4.4 Funding for replacement of w scrubber(s) on the second floor of cooked food centre had been secu. The works was expected to take 36 working days. Stall opera	the red.

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Agenda	affected by the works would be granted waiver of rental and air-conditioning fee for the period of business suspension.  EMSD said they would invite tenders and procure water scrubber(s). The project was expected to commence in July at the earliest. Stall operators decided after deliberation that the cooked food market would be completely closed in order to carry out the above works. Meanwhile, ASD would carry out some minor maintenance and refurbishment works and the management office would arrange cleansing and pest control services. Stall operators affected by the works would be granted waiver of rental and air-conditioning fee for the period of business suspension. FEHD would continue the discussion with stall operators to work out the actual period of stall closure, during which the above works would be carried out.	Market
	4.5 The replacement of a batch of 50 devices used by the drainage pipes to block rubbish was completed in early October last year by ASD. FEHD would further procure and replace the aged or defective devices as and when necessary. Stall operators pointed out that defects were found in individual new devices. ASD would be mindful of the situation when procuring the devices for replacement. EMSD had completed the repair works for escalator E5 which was damaged due to sewage backflow caused by drain blockage. Stall operators were reminded not to	Sai Ying Pun Market

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	dump rubbish in the drains or remove the devices used by the drainage pipes to block rubbish.	
	4.6 The replacement and repair works for the Market's fresh water and sewage pipes was completed. FEHD was handling matters concerning waiver of rental and air-conditioning fee for stall operators who were affected during the course of works.	
	4.7 Refurbishment of the Market's Unloading Area was in progress. Upon completion, the height restriction would be 3.4 meters. ASD had put up a warning sign at the entrance.	
	4.8 Seepage was found at the canopy of the Market during heavy rainstorms. ASD had completed most of the necessary repairs. The situation had improved despite there being water leakage at certain parts of the canopy. Further repair works arranged by ASD would be carried out.	
	4.9 Seepage was found at the external wall of the Market. ASD had completed the necessary repairs on 10 September 2015 and stall operators were thanked for offering cooperation on this matter. Since seepage had also been found at the roof of the Market, repair works arranged by ASD would be carried out.	Centre Street Market

	4.11 Stall operators reported that the lift buttons did not function properly and that the lift occasionally skipped G/F o the Market. The situation had improved after EMSD completed the necessary checking and maintenance work.	
	4.12 EMSD completed the modernisation work of electrical installations in December last year. The modernisation work of the E5 escalato commenced in mid-February and wa expected to be completed on 15 March The modernisation work of the E6 escalator would commence immediately upon the completion of the aforementioned works and wa expected to be completed on 12 April. 	4.13 The installation of handrails for the disabled and elderly at the Queen's Road West entrance near the fruit stal area on G/F was completed on 20 January. The stall operators were thanked for offering cooperation on thi matter.	Market  1
	4.14 A questionnaire survey to solicit stal operators' views on the retrofitting of air-conditioning systems was conducted on 7 October. 7. Pest Problem	7.1 A total of 242 rodents were trapped alive and poisoned dead between September 2015 and April 2016.	
8.  Security Probl em	8.1 Stall operators had raised the issue relating to the security at the staircase exit in the red brick area. After ASE had repaired the defective door closer the rear door could now be closed properly.	
	8.2 The two-year security services contract was renewed on 1 April. The new contractor was Sky Wise Services Management Limited.	Food Market
9. Other Business	9.1 The amended Imported Game, Meat Poultry and Eggs Regulations came into	

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	operation on 5 December 2015. The amendments mainly extended control to imported eggs, such as the requirement of a health certificate or the permission in writing of a health officer for importing eggs.
