

2024 Hong Kong Cyclothon

1. Objectives

1.1 The 2024 Hong Kong Cyclothon (Event), organised by the Hong Kong Tourism Board, is scheduled to be held on 13 October 2024. This paper outlines the event information and temporary traffic arrangements of the 2024 Event.

2. Event Background

2.1. Hong Kong Tourism Board (HKTB) is tasked to market and promote Hong Kong as a travel destination worldwide and to enhance visitors' experience in Hong Kong, by hosting different mega events.

2.2. The Hong Kong Cyclothon was debuted in 2015 in the theme of “Sports for All” and “Exercise for a Good Cause” to promote the sport of cycling to the general public, to showcase Cyclothon as an Asia’s celebrated branded to attract more tourists from the Mainland and overseas to visit Hong Kong for participation and to enhance worldwide publicity. Over the years, the event attracted more than 30,000 local and overseas amateur and professional cyclists to participate in various cycling programmes and professional races.

2.3. With a view to promote Hong Kong as a hub of international tourism events in the Greater Bay Area, HKTB will invite riders from the Greater Bay Area to compete in the City Cycling Challenge around Greater Bay Area (Hong Kong) - Men’s Open and Women’s Open.

2.4. To enhance festivities with expanded experiences, a Carnival offering an array of wellness workshops, dining and fun-filled activities will be held alongside the event next to the Finish Line in West Kowloon Cultural District. Participants of the 50km and 32km Rides, visitors and locals alike could hang out with their friends and families, enjoying an energetic weekend.

3. 2024 Event Information

3.1 Event Date

2024 Hong Kong Cyclothon is scheduled for 13 October 2024 (Sunday). The HKTB will organise the 50km Ride, 32km Ride, Family Fun Ride, CEO Charity and Celebrity Ride, City Cycling Challenge around Greater Bay Area (Hong Kong) - Men’s Open and Women’s Open this year.

3.2 Route (Please refer to Appendix 1 for more information on event routes)

3.2.1 50km Ride and 32km Ride

In this edition, the starting point for all cycling programmes will be situated at Salisbury Road (W/B), near Empire Centre. The 50km Ride will begin at 5:15am. Participants will depart in batches from Tsim Sha Tsui East and ride towards West Kowloon direction via West Kowloon Highway and Tsing Kwai Highway, into Cheung Tsing Bridge and Tsing Ma Bridge, then U-turn at Ma Wan end. Participants will proceed to Ting Kau Bridge and then U-turn. They will continue the ride along Nam Wan tunnel, Stonecutters bridge, Tsing Sha Highway, Eagle’s Nest Tunnel and Sha Tin Heights Tunnel, then head back towards West Kowloon. To finish,

participants will ride back to Jordan Road Flyover via Lin Cheung Road and Nga Cheung Road.

The 32km Ride will begin at 7:45am. Participants of the 32km ride will ride towards West Kowloon direction via West Kowloon Highway and Tsing Kwai Highway into Cheung Tsing Tunnel. Participants will proceed to Ting Kau Bridge, Nam Wan Tunnel, Stonecutters Bridge and then head back towards West Kowloon. To finish, participants will ride back to Jordan Road Flyover via Lin Cheung Road and Nga Cheung Road.

During the event, Kowloon Park Drive (S/B), Nathan Road, Chatham Road South will not be affected. The section of Salisbury Road (W/B) between Chatham Road South and Nathan Road will be reopened at or before 9:30am. To ensure participants' safety and smooth event operation, the HKTB will continue to work closely with various government departments accordingly.

Route - 50km Ride

START from Tsim Sha Tsui Salisbury Road (W/B, near Empire Centre) → Kowloon Park Drive (N/B) → Canton Road (N/B) → Austin Road West (W/B) → Nga Cheung Road Flyover (N/B) → Nga Cheung Road Flyover (S/B) → Nga Cheung Road (S/B) → Turning Point 1 → Nga Cheung Road (S/B) → Turning Point 2 → West Kowloon Highway (S/B) → Tsing Kwai Highway (S/B) → Cheung Tsing Bridge (Kln/B) → Cheung Tsing Tunnel (Kln/B) → Cheung Tsing Highway (S/B) → Tsing Yi North West Interchange (S/B) → Lantau Link (E/B) → Tsing Ma Bridge (Kln/B) → Turning Point 3 (Tsing Ma Bridge Upper Deck near slip road from Ma Wan) → Tsing Ma Bridge (Kln/B) → Lantau Link (E/B) → Tsing Sha Highway (E/B) → Turning Point 4 (Cheung Tsing Highway (S/B) near slip road from Tsing Yi Road West) → Cheung Tsing Highway (S/B) → Ting Kau Bridge (Kln/B) → Tsing Long Highway (S/B) → Turning Point 5 (Tsing Long Highway near slip road from Tsuen Wan) → Tsing Long Highway (S/B) → Ting Kau Bridge (Kln/B) → Cheung Tsing Highway (S/B) → Tsing Sha Highway (E/B) → Nam Wan Tunnel (Kln/B) → Stonecutters Bridge (Kln/B) → Tsing Sha Highway (E/B) → Eagle's Nest Tunnel (Shatin/B) → Sha Tin Heights Tunnel (Shatin/B) → Turning Point 6 (near MTR Tai Wai Depot) → Sha Tin Heights Tunnel (Shatin/B) → Eagle's Nest Tunnel (Shatin/B) → Tsing Sha Highway (E/B) → Turning Point 7 (near Lai Po Road) → West Kowloon Highway (S/B) → Nga Cheung Road (S/B) → Jordan Road (E/B) → Turning Point 8 → FINISH Jordan Road (E/B). Total distance is approximately 50km.

Route - 32km Ride

START from Tsim Sha Tsui Salisbury Road (W/B, near Empire Centre) → Kowloon Park Drive (N/B) → Canton Road (N/B) → Austin Road West (W/B) → Nga Cheung Road Flyover (N/B) → Nga Cheung Road Flyover (S/B) → Nga Cheung Road (S/B) → Turning Point 1 → Nga Cheung Road (S/B) → Turning Point 2 → West Kowloon Highway (S/B) → Tsing Kwai Highway (S/B) → Cheung Tsing Bridge (Kln/B) → Cheung Tsing Tunnel (Kln/B) → Cheung Tsing Highway (S/B) → Ting Kau Bridge (Kln/B) → Tsing Long Highway (S/B) → Turning Point 3 (Cheung Tsing Highway near slip road from Tsuen Wan) → Tsing Long Highway (S/B) → Ting Kau Bridge (Kln/B) → Cheung Tsing Highway (S/B) → Tsing Sha Highway (E/B) → Nam Wan Tunnel (Kln/B) → Stonecutters Bridge (Kln/B) → Tsing Sha Highway (E/B) → West Kowloon Highway (S/B) → Lin Cheung Road (S/B) → Nga Cheung Road (S/B) →

Jordan Road (E/B) → Turning Point 4 → FINISH Jordan Road (E/B). Total distance is approximately 32km.

3.2.2 Family Fun Ride

HKTB will designate a 1 km route on Salisbury Road, Tsim Sha Tsui, which allows 300 participants from 150 families, including parents with their kids aged six or above, to enjoy riding in the city centre and sharing sportive and joyful family time.

3.2.3 CEO Charity and Celebrity Ride

Aiming at putting “Exercise for a Good Cause” into action, HKTB will invite senior executives and celebrities to ride with a good cause, while experiencing the excitement of cycling in Tsim Sha Tsui East.

3.2.4 City Cycling Challenge around Greater Bay Area (Hong Kong) - Men’s Open and Women’s Open

The 3.7 km circuit route will circulate along Salisbury Road and Hung Hom Bypass, offering the general public a chance to appreciate exciting professional road races held in the city centre. With the support of the Sports Bureau of Guangdong Province and the Cycling Association of Guangdong Province, HKTB will continue to invite Greater Bay Area riders to compete together, fostering interconnection between Greater Bay Area cities.

3.3 Road Closures and Traffic Arrangements During the Event

3.3.1 Taken into account the experience from organising the Event in previous years, with an aim to mitigate the nuisance brought about by the event, the HKTB will carry out multiple improvement measures such as increasing communication with participants and public as well as optimizing traffic arrangements. In light of the adjustment in event programme, it is expected that all closed roads in Tsim Sha Tsui East and Hung Hom area could be reopened at 3:30pm.

3.3.2 On routing, the HKTB has appointed a traffic consultant to assess the impact of the road closures and associated traffic arrangements brought about to traffic flow and other road users. Adequate planning and temporary traffic arrangements, including providing alternative routings will be in place. The Hong Kong Police Force, the Transport Department and the Fire Services Department have expressed their supports to the various routes of the 2024 Event in principle. The tentative road closure schedule is shown below:

Prohibited Zone at Slip Road from Jordan Road to Western Harbour Crossing will be rescinded from 1:00am to 11:00am on 13 October 2024. Prohibited Zone at Tsim Sha Tsui East (Mody Road) Bus Terminus will be rescinded from 11:00am to 3:30am on 13 October 2024. Temporary traffic arrangements will be implemented.

3.3.3 The HKTB will continue to work closely with government departments to work out the final traffic diversions and transport arrangements. To ensure the affected roads will be re-opened as planned and minimize the impact to local traffic and citizens, a numbers of time-cut checkpoints will be set up along the route. Broom wagons and trucks will be deployed at these checkpoints, including Tsing Ma Bridge, Tsing Long Highway, Nam Wan Tunnel, Tsing Sha Highway and Sha Tin Heights Tunnel. Participants who fail to arrive at the checkpoints before the designated finishing time will be asked to re-route or board the broom wagon and sent to West Kowloon.

3.3.4 Routes of public transport services within the road closure boundaries will be diverted and the corresponding stops will be temporarily relocated. Other road users are required to follow the temporary traffic diversions to reach the destinations. Temporary traffic signs will be displayed at closed road junctions to advise members of the general public of the temporary traffic arrangements. To avoid preempting emergency services, emergency vehicle access will be reserved for Police and Fire Services accordingly.

3.4 Road Closure Schedule

3.4.1 It is unavoidable that residents and merchants in the vicinity of the road closure area will be affected on the event day. In order to communicate the general public about the latest road closure arrangements and allows ample time for them to plan their journey on event day, the HKTB will coordinate with affected public transport service providers and share the road closures and transport arrangements information at a press conference prior to the event. Besides, messages about road closures will be on display at the Variable Message Signs in major highways. The tentative road closure schedule is shown as follows:

3.5 Programme Schedule

3.5.1 To enhance the safety of participants, the 50km Ride and 32km Ride will take place at different times. Please refer to tentative programme schedule below:

3.6 Cycling Technique Assessment

3.6.1 Except the persons mentioned in the below clause, aiming to achieve a safe event and ensure participants are aware of the safety regulations, all participants of 50km Ride and 32km Ride are required to pass a cycling technique assessment (CTA).

3.6.2 Exemption will be granted to the following groups (participants must provide valid proof to the Organiser):

- participants who passed the CTA of the 2023 Sun Hung Kai Properties Hong Kong Cyclothon; or
- finishers of the 50 km Ride or 30 km Ride of the 2022 or 2023 Sun Hung Kai Properties Hong Kong Cyclothon; or
- participants who have completed the road races organised by The Cycling Association of Hong Kong, China ("CAHK") held between 1 January 2023 and 1 July 2024; or
- participants who have completed the road races organised by the Union Cycliste Internationale ("UCI") held between 1 January 2023 and 1 July 2024; or
- experienced cyclists who have completed other eligible cycling competitions (such as those by any of the National Cycling Federations) or mass road events held between 1 January 2023 and 1 July 2024

3.7 Shuttle Bus Arrangements and Briefing Session

3.7.1 Since the 50km Ride will start at 5:15am, shuttle bus services will be provided to participants at 10 locations. More information about shuttle bus arrangements will be announced on the official event website.

3.7.2 A briefing session for participants will be held to provide more detailed information about the event, including important reminders, en-route locations of turning points and slopes, road conditions, safety regulations and other reminders.

3.8 Special Weather and Emergency Arrangements

- 3.8.1** If a Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 3 or above is hoisted, or a Red or Black Rainstorm Warning Signal is in force anytime during the event, the Hong Kong Cyclothon will be cancelled.
- 3.8.2** On event day, the Organiser will set up a joint command post (JCP) that involves Hong Kong Police Force (HKPF), Hong Kong Fire Services Department (HKFSD), Transport Department (TD), Auxiliary Medical Service (AMS) and Hong Kong St. John Ambulance to oversee the event and carry out any actions as appropriate. In case of emergency during the road closure period of the event, e.g. when nearby residents called ambulance for rescue or emergency vehicles are required to access closed roads, members of the JCP will communicate with corresponding zone officials via radio to immediately suspend the race and ensure the access of the emergency vehicles without delay.
- 3.8.3** The Organiser will liaise with AMS and Hospital Authority (HA) to work out the numbers of stand-by ambulance, the locations of the first-aid posts and the routes of ambulances to the nearest hospitals before the event. During the event, the Organiser will deploy ambulance-aid motorcycles and ambulances at different locations, as well as follow the last participant after the start of the race. In case of emergency, ambulance-aid motorcycle will be the first attending party to carry out first-aid treatment. Subject to the situation of the injured participants after first-aid treatment, he/she may be sent to the nearest hospital. Close contact with AMS, HA and HKFSD will be maintained throughout the event.

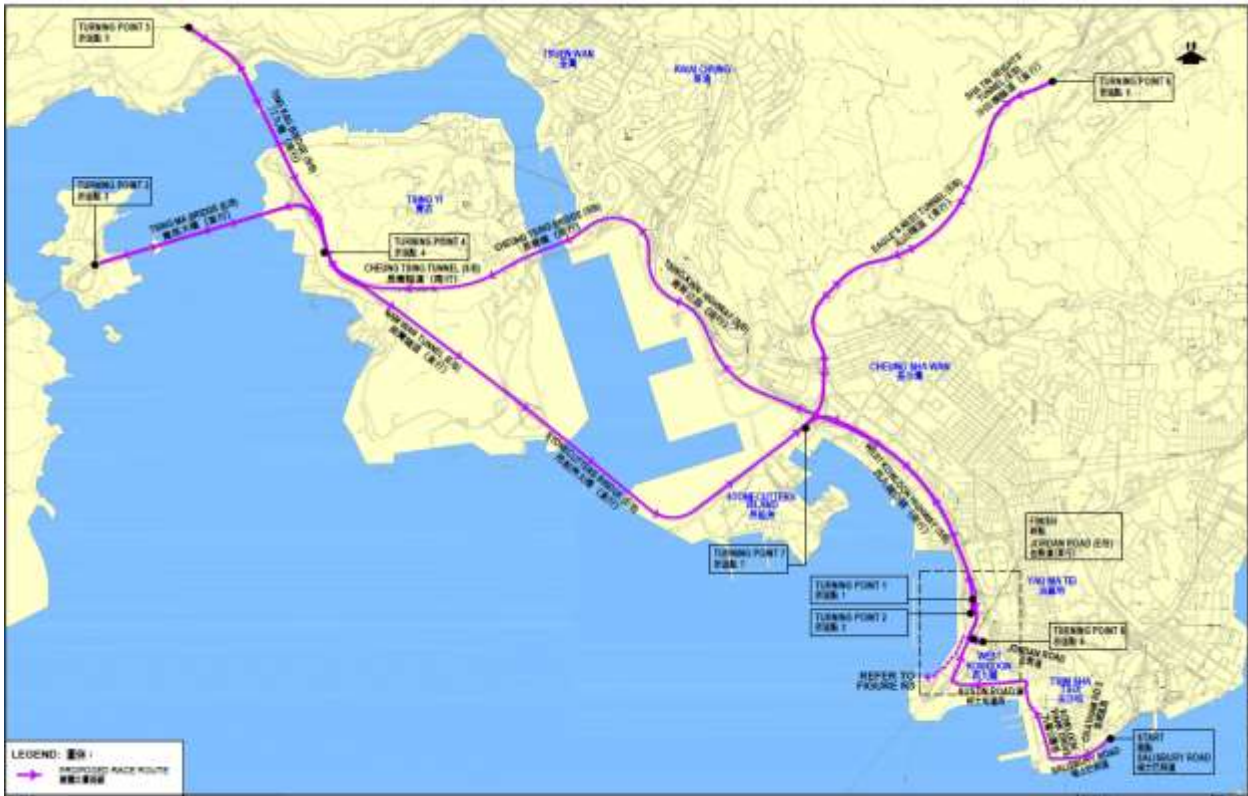
