

Operational Priorities

National Security

- Enhance frontline officers' skill and knowledge of their roles and responsibilities, and intelligence gathering capability in safeguarding national security.
- Enhance communication and cooperation with relevant community stakeholders, and enlist the public's trust and support for the roles and responsibilities of the Police in safeguarding national security.

Violent Crime

- Ensure effective, strong, and highly visible police presence at key locations to deter violent crime, particularly at high-risk locations.
- Strengthen intelligence-led operations against street gangs and their activities, particularly those involving youths.
- Ensure professional and sensitive case handling when investigating violent crime, particularly those cases involving vulnerable persons.

Triads, Syndicated and Organised Crime

Take proactive enforcement action against debt-collection agencies who threaten life and property, in particular those who seek to exploit youths.

Drugs and Substance Abuse by Students and Youths

Adopt a multi-agency and community-based approach to prevent drugs and substance abuse by students and youths.

Quick Cash Crime

- Raise public awareness to prevent quick cash crime, particularly pickpocket and all forms of deception and fraud.
- Strengthen community support to interdict shop and miscellaneous theft.

Cyber Security and Technology Crime

- Enhance public awareness on cyber security and technology crime as well as the risks and liabilities associated with social media and the Internet with particular emphasis on deception.
- Take proactive measures to investigate and gather intelligence for tackling technology crime and cyber attack.

Operational Priorities

Burglary / Smuggling

Effectively task and deploy police resources to deter burglary and smuggling, and reassure local communities.

Street Management

Implement consistent and determined enforcement action to deter Street Gambling, Illegal Parking and other anti-social behaviours.

Public Safety

(a) Public Disorder

- Promote a law-abiding culture in the community through co-operation with different stakeholders, including government bureaux/departments, schools and non-governmental organisations (NGOs).
- Enhance preparedness, readiness and capability in dealing with all public disorder.
- Provide rapid and effective response to all public disorder.
- Enhance cooperation with different stakeholders including government bureaux/departments, private entities, schools and NGOs, and enlist their support in maintaining and restoring public order and safety during and after any incidents of public disorder.

(b) Public Events

- Strengthen public trust, understanding of, and support for, the roles and responsibilities of Police in maintaining national security, public order and safety for the community, in particular among youths.
- Engage organisers, the media and other stakeholders of public events to enhance mutual understanding and enlist their support.
- Ensure public events, sports, entertainment and celebratory events are held in a safe and orderly manner, through proactive engagement and coordination with relevant stakeholders, including event organisers, venue operators and different government bureaux/ departments for effective planning and execution.

(c) Road Safety

- Implement a multi-agency approach to promote road safety and reduce fatal and serious traffic accidents.
- Ensure smooth traffic flow through application of the Selected Traffic Enforcement Priorities (STEP) and the use of technology.

(d) Major Incidents and Extreme Weather

- Ensure preparedness for the rescue phase of major incidents and extreme weather situation by conducting regular multi-agency exercises to test and improve contingency plans.
- Provide a professional, coordinated and rapid response through cooperation among government bureau/departments and engagement with stakeholders community-wide.

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Terrorism

- Build capacity, enhance intelligence gathering and operational readiness through regular training and multi-agency exercises.
- Enhance public participation and preparedness against terrorist or violent attacks by collaboration with the operators of critical infrastructure and other key locations including MTRC, HK Disneyland and Ngong Ping 360 to enhance protection, reduce vulnerability and strengthen multi-agency response capability.
